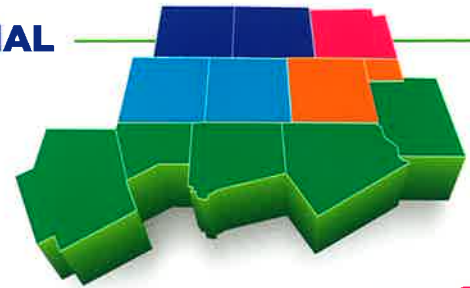

So, we gathered input from our community leaders and assessed the areas we serve to determine the following Community Impact priorities:

- 1 COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT**
 - Mental health and substance abuse
 - Impact of exercise, nutrition and weight on chronic disease
 - Access to health services and health care navigation and literacy
- 2 SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH**
 - Culturally appropriate health and nutrition education
 - Food security such as availability of affordable, healthy food
 - Reliable access to preventive health care and affordable prescriptions
 - Addressing social and community isolation
- 3 FAITH COMMUNITY HEALTH**
 - Faith community nursing initiatives
 - Attending clergy association initiatives
